CLAVERRACK Nancy B. Johnson, 85, of Claverack, passed away on Tuesday, April 7, 2009 at Barnwell Nursing and Rehab Center where she courageously faced lung cancer.

Nancy was born to George E. and Bessie L. (Bauer) Gambier-Bousfield in 1923 in Brooklyn, New York, the third of four daughters. Early in her childhood the family moved to Rutherford, New Jersey, where she spent her youth. She attended Ursinus College in Pennsylvania for two years before transferring to Cornell University's New York Hospital School of Nursing in New York City and earned a BS in nursing in 1947.

It was here that she met her future husband Robert, who was attending Cornell Medical College, during his hospitalization for the mumps. Married in 1946, Nancy supported him by working as a pediatric nurse at New York Hospital while he finished his education. After raising her children she worked in his office for ten years as a medical receptionist prior to retirement.

Robert's military service commitments and career took Nancy and her husband to England, New York

City, Fort Wayne, Indiana and finally Claverack, New York, where they built a home, raised four children and lived for nearly 50 years. She was a Girl Scout leader, assistant den mother for Cub Scouts, and an active member of the Columbia Memorial Hospital Medical Auxiliary. Her sewing and knitting talents graced the annual church bazaar at the Reformed Dutch Church of Claverack, where she was a member.

Together Nancy and Robert climbed many of the Adirondack high peaks, maintained a seasonal residence in Newcomb, New York, and introduced their children to this special place where Robert grew up.

Nancy is survived by her husband of 63 years, Robert; their children, Kathryn Schneider and her husband William of Stuyvesant; Deborah Langford and husband William of Media, PA; Jeffrey Johnson and his wife Alissa Ferlito of North Greenbush; Thomas Johnson and his wife Mary Beth of Albany, and her sister Mary Bousfield; as well as seven grandchildren: Timothy and Rachel Schneider, Daniel and Stephen Langford, and Peter, Michael and Christa Johnson.

For many years Nancy was a proud and faithful participant in the nationwide Nurses' Health Study, a long-term investigation of risk factors affecting women's health.
