/Was given a newspaper which listed William Aubrey 60 who died 100 years ago, 8 Dec. 1910 in Warrensburg. He was riding in one of the first autos in Newcomb, on the road from Newcomb to Long Lake in the previous spring. When it hit a deer. It rolled over and burned. William was injured./

/He was survived by 7 kids; Jennie, Ethel, /

/Maud, William Jr. and Warren Aubrey, also by Mrs Mabel MCGovern and Mrs. Mary Bissell of Newcomb./

/His father was Charles and mother Sarah Aikins or /

/Orkins of Panton, Addison county, Vermont. They were Scotch and English./

/He had brothers Fred and Edgar of Fort Edward, N.Y. /

/and a sister Adelaide who wed Warren B. Williams. .They lived on the North side of the river that runs into Lake Harris, near the rapids./

/A daughter Edith 1869-1879 died from diptheria /

/and is buried in Williams cemetery West of the Newcomb House bar./

/A son Orrin /

/1868- wed Gertrude Hall and lived in the house East of the old Catholic church. Their son

Russell 1893-1897 is buried in Williams cemetery./  
/A brother to Orrin, Harrison was born /  
/1877./  
/Living with them was Sarah, mother of Wm. Aubrey. /  
/She died in 1897 age 91, and is presumably in Williams cemetery without a marker/

/IN 1892 Wm. Aubrey was living in a house on /  
/the West side of the Newcomb Lake road with his wife Mary R. and kids Mabel, William Jr  
., Mary, Warren and Jennie. He was a stone mason./  
/By 1905 most of them were gone to /  
/Warrensburg except for Mary Jr. who wed Frank Bissell and they lived in the house that  
Shatsky bought./  
/Jennie was working in the Herrick family house in /  
/Warrensburg in 1910./  
/Warren Jr. wed Mary Montena and their son Warren B. /  
/died 1914 age 35 of T.B. in Fort Edward. Their daughter Mary R. died in 1923 age 67. /

///There was an obit for Adele Wagner Boyd in the 25 April 2011 Post Star. It doesn't mention Newcomb at all. I remember her as Adele Wagner, a language teacher in Newcomb School. Looked in old year books and school papers which mentioned her from at least 1947 to 1952 or more. Newcomb wasn't mentioned in an article in the same paper on Helen Finch Foulds, a daughter of Daniel Finch of Finch & Pruyn company of Glens Falls. She lived in the house across from the Lake Harris bar but the bar wasn't there in those days, it was only a cottage. She probably only spent summers in the house on the hill that Deverne and Gloria Rist later owned. George Shaughnessy remembered her well. She hired him to move everything in the house to her mansion in Glens Falls. When he took a load to Glens Falls, she would give him a list of what she wanted him to bring in the next load, no more, no less. She was very demanding. When George loaded one list of things, he had a lot of room left. Thinking he would save a trip, he added a very nice set of wicker furniture. He put it over her garage in Glens Falls without telling her. When he had everything moved, she paid him and told him he could have the set of wicker furniture still in her house in Newcomb. He didn't dare to tell her he had put it over her garage. So he never got it./ I think I forgot to include the obit for Gary Bickford... from the PostStar NEWCOMB, N.Y. - Gary Bickford, 65, died April 7, 2011, unexpectedly at his residence. Gary was born Sept. 10, 1945, the son of Margaret Morse Bickford and Roswell Bickford. Gary retired after twenty years in the Navy and returned to Newcomb to care for his father. He played golf, enjoyed bowling, read mysteries and loved crossword puzzles. He was also a model railroader. Gary was predeceased by his parents, Margaret and Roswell Bickford. He is survived by his sister, Veronica Abare and her husband, Francis of Millsboro, Del., also many nieces and nephews. Graveside services will be conducted at a later date at the Newcomb Cemetery.
